Bondey started at MCFS in 2012 as a Temple University student intern where she provided support to participants in our Preparing Older Youths for Success (POYS) and Behavioral Support Programs.

Bondey provided job preparation and career counseling support to the youths in our POYS program. She also assisted with our Behavioral Support program by providing counseling services to an immigrant youth while advocating for him and providing cultural education to his teachers in the Upper Darby School District.

In 2012, after Bondey completed her Bachelors Degree in Liberal Arts with concentrations in Psychology and Women's Studies, she returned to her home in Grand Gedeth, a country in Liberia.

Shortly after returning home,

Bondey volunteered as a Motivational Speaker at the Sarah Rich Foundation. In this role, she encouraged young women who opted to learn a trade instead of completing high school, to consider obtaining their high school diplomas.

In 2013, Bondey returned to the states and to MCFS as a volunteer with the Social Service and Home Care Divisions (Attentive Home Care). Bondey thrived in her roles at MCFS and was soon offered a permanent position as a Home Care Monitor. Within months she was offered a position as a Home & Community Based Case Manager with AHC.

Bondey is excited to return home to her family in Grand Gedeh, especially to her husband of 2 years. She is already making plans to make an impact once she returns home. She intends on resuming her work in social services as a motivational speaker or through advocacy



work at the UN.

Ultimately, Bondey would like to further her education. She is considering obtaining a Master's Degree or a Juris Doctorate. Although she is undecided as to which field to enter, we are certain that whichever path she chooses, she will do wonderfully.
