A Pathway to Endless Opportunities through MCFS' POYS Program

"I wanted to go back to college", this desire led Ms. Natalia Guillen to MCFS' ARRA (American Recovery & Reinvestment Act) program, a subsidiary of the POYS program (Preparing Older Youths for Success) funded by the Delaware County Office of Employment & Training (currently known as the Delaware County Workforce Investment Board).

In 2010, Natalia came to the US with several goals. Her primary goals were to become fluent in English and to further her education.

Natalia had already earned her undergraduate degree in Accounting and Business Administration from the University of Costa Rica. Unfortunately, her degree was not widely accepted in the States. Natalia's sister had information about MCFS' Preparing Older Youths for Success program (POYS) and suggested that she enroll.

As a POYS participant, Natalia was provided with assistance enrolling in Delaware County Community
College (DCCC) where she took ESL classes. Through POYS' ARRA program, she was placed at a paid internship at Marshalls (formerly located in the 69th Street business district). She also attended weekly group sessions at MCFS with her peers where topics such as customer service ethics, professional behavioral and personal growth were discussed.

Natalia participated in the POYS Program for 8 months. After the program ended, she obtained her tax preparation certificate from H&R Block and worked for the company during tax seasons.
Enrolling in the
MBA Program at
Philadelphia University was the next
step for Natalia.

Natalia kept in contact with MCFS, updating us on her accomplishments. She provided in-

kind accounting services to MCFS for 6 months until being offered an 8 month paid internship at Graham Partners in Newtown, Square, PA, an opportunity funded by MCFS supporter Steve Graham.

After obtaining her MBA from
Philadelphia University in 2013, she
was offered a full time accounting
position at D. Thomas Manieri in Clifton
Heights, PA. Natalia returned to MCFS
in 2014 as our full time accountant.

When asked to name the most valuable ideal she learned through the POYS program, she could not answer. Natalia stated she learned so many valuable things, she could not narrow it down to just one. She stated she learned professional and personal skills she currently utilizes. She also learned a great deal about American culture which was instrumental in helping her navigate her way through school and in her community.

When asked for words of wisdom to pass along to current POYS participants, Natalia stated, "continue your studies, finish your GED, it is hard but it is worth it. It is an effort that pays off in the future".

MCFS is proud to have Natalia with us as an employee. We have watched her grow and reach all of the goals she set for herself. We are honored to have supported her in the early stages of her professional career. We would like to take this opportunity to extend our gratitude to Natalia. Thank you for choosing POYS; for trusting MCFS to support you; for sharing your talents with MCFS and thank you for allowing us to proudly share your story. We also want to extend a Congratulations to Natalia on her recent nuptials to Mr. Carl Kissa. The couple wed on January 18th in Costa Rica. Congrats and best wishes to you both.
